Mission

To prepare our students to function, academically and socially, by providing educational services that reduce the risk of recidivism upon their return to a regular school environment.

Vision

Empowering the students to obtain the skills to grow socially and emotionally by providing a campus wide positive behavior interventions and supports program including the following core values: Respect, Responsibility, and Safety.

Academics

Students receive comprehensive instruction in Mathematics, English Language Arts, Social Studies, and Science during their placement. All core content grades will be implemented by the DAEP teachers. All elective classwork and grades will be provided by the home campus teachers.

Counseling

Each student will participate in individual counseling focused on identified student needs specific to each student. In addition, each student will participate in a social skills group that addresses student needs, such as good decision making, anger management strategies, problem solving, and positive social interactions.

We have met our program goals when a student returns to his/her home campus, generalizes targeted behaviors, and is academically and socially successful.

Students are subject to additional days being added when tardy or being picked up late by parent/guardian.

Parent Responsibilities

Parent support is essential for the success of the student at the DAEP.

To ensure your child's success, your assistance is needed in the following areas:

- Attend the intake meeting at the scheduled time. Intake meetings are held at the DAEP facility, located at the Lone Star building. (See location direction on back).
- Check-in and check-out your child daily.
- Call 915-877-7677 to report an absence or tardy.
- Maintain open, honest communication with DAEP staff.
- 5. Work as a partner with the DAEP staff.

Parent- teacher/staff communication is very important to us, and parents are invited to call the school as often as needed.

Parents must bring prescriptions to school in an appropriately labeled prescription bottle with a copy of the doctor's orders regarding its use. Parents must pick-up unused medication from the DAEP on the last day of the student's placement term.

Student Responsibilities

To achieve success at the DAEP, the student must strive to:

- Complete assigned academic and social skills tasks.

Students must wear the school uniform:

- w hite collared button-up shirt (long sleeve)
- black or khaki slacks
- black tie or bowtie
- black, white, grey, or brown shoes (solid) No other colors/drawings
- White or black socks only

Students are NOT ALLOWED to wear:

- Jewelry
- Cosmetics
- Head gear
- Boots or sandals



Students are prohibited from going to their home campus, any other Canutillo ISD school, and any CISD function during the time they attend the DAEP.

Absences do not count toward completion of a student's assigned term and these days must be made up.

Further violations of the Student Code of Conduct may result in additional disciplinary action including a longer term at the DAEP.
